- **P** In the name of the Father and of the


 → Son and of the Holy Spirit.

First Lesson

Genesis 3:8-13, 22-24

- ⁸ Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the LORD God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and they hid from the LORD God among the trees of the garden. ⁹ But the LORD God called to the man, "Where are you?"
- ¹⁰ He answered, "I heard you in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid."
- ¹¹ And he said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree that I commanded you not to eat from?"
- ¹² The man said, "The woman you put here with me—she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate it."
- ¹³ Then the LORD God said to the woman, "What is this you have done?"

The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

²² And the LORD God said, "The man has now become like one of us, knowing good and evil. He must not be allowed to reach out his hand and take also from the tree of life and eat, and live forever." ²³ So the LORD God banished him from the Garden of Eden to work the ground from which he had been taken. ²⁴ After he drove the man out, he placed on the east side of the Garden of Eden cherubim and a flaming sword flashing back and forth to guard the way to the tree of life.

Second Lesson


Hebrews 11:13-16

¹³ All these people were still living by faith when they died. They did not receive the things promised; they only saw them and welcomed them from a distance, admitting that they were foreigners and strangers on earth. ¹⁴ People who say such things show that they are looking for a country of their own. ¹⁵ If they had been thinking of the country they had left, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶ Instead, they were longing for a better country—a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.

Holy Gospel

The Holy Gospel, according to St Matthew the 4th chapter.



Matthew 4:1-11

- **4** Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. ² After fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. ³ The tempter came to him and said, "If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread."
- ⁴ Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God."
- ⁵ Then the devil took him to the holy city and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. ⁶ "If you are the Son of God," he said, "throw yourself down. For it is written:
- "He will command his angels concerning you, and they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone."
- ⁷ Jesus answered him, "It is also written: 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.""
- ⁸ Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor. ⁹ "All this I will give you," he said, "if you will bow down and worship me."
- ¹⁰ Jesus said to him, "Away from me, Satan! For it is written: 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only.""
- ¹¹ Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him.

And we believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church,


We acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins,


and we look for the resurrection of the dead




C Our Father who art in heaven,

forever and ever. Amen.


