

Royal Redeemer Going Deeper Guide

• **CONNECT** with each other

o This Sunday is Super Bowl 58. Imagine if the Super Bowl were played with a giant balloon instead of a football. How would the dynamics of the game change, and which team do you think would have the best balloon-handling skills?

• GROW in Christ

After six days Jesus took Peter, James and John with him and led them up a high mountain, where they were all alone. There he was transfigured before them. 3 His clothes became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them. 4 And there appeared before them Elijah and Moses, who were talking with Jesus.

5 Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." 6 (He did not know what to say, they were so frightened.)

7 Then a cloud appeared and covered them, and a voice came from the cloud: "This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!"

8 Suddenly, when they looked around, they no longer saw anyone with them except Jesus.
9 As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus gave them orders not to tell anyone what they had seen until the Son of Man had risen from the dead.

Mark 9:2-9

- o Share any words or phrases that speak into your life today.
- o Why do Elijah and Moses appear with Jesus during the Transfiguration (Mark 9:4)? What might their presence signify?
- o How does Peter respond to the vision of the Transfiguration, and what does his suggestion about building tents for Jesus, Moses, and Elijah reveal about his understanding?
- o What does the voice from the cloud say in Mark 9:7, and how does it emphasize Jesus' identity?
- o Jesus instructs Peter, James, and John to keep silent about what they witnessed until after the resurrection. Why might Jesus give this command, and what does it suggest about the unfolding of His mission?

- o Reflect on the significance of the Transfiguration in the larger context of Jesus' ministry. How does this event relate to His identity and mission?
- o Explore any connections between the Transfiguration and Old Testament themes or prophecies. How might this event fulfill or echo previous revelations?
- o In what ways does the Transfiguration display the glory of Jesus, and how might this concept of glory be understood in a biblical context?
- o How can the principles and themes in Mark 9:2-9 be applied to the lives of modern-day believers?
- o In what ways might the Transfiguration inspire Christians to approach their understanding of Jesus' identity and mission?
