Based on the sermon for November 17, 2024 GOODNESS OF GOD: What Gratitude Changes



For personal reflection or for use as a devotion with a CGS Community or family

- Begin by reflecting on/sharing a high and/or a low from your week
- **CONNECT** with each other
 - O Share a memory of Thanksgiving with your family growing up.
- **GROW** in Christ (Read the following scripture from **Philippians 2: 1-11**)

Imitating Christ's Humility

2 Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, ² then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. ³ Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, ⁴ not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others. ⁵ In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: ⁶ Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to His own advantage; ⁷ rather, He made Himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.

⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, He <u>humbled Himself</u> by <u>becoming obedient</u> to death— even death on a cross! ⁹ Therefore God exalted Him to the highest place and gave Him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

- O Share any words or phrases that speak into your life today.
- O Paul tells the church at Phillipi, and us, to have the same attitude (or mindset as the NIV translates it) as Christ Jesus. What is that attitude? (see verses 8 and 3)
- O How does having a humble attitude help to make us more grateful as opposed to feeling entitled to what gifts we've been given?
- O In our Gospel reading for today (Mark 10: 23-31) Jesus says that it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven. Why is that? (Hint: read Mark 10: 17-22 in light of the 1st commandment: "You shall have no other gods than God". What might the rich man's god be.)
- O The disciples' response was "who then can be saved?" How does this realization of sin, help them have an attitude of gratitude toward the salvation God will provide?
- O How does realizing the extent of <u>our</u> sinfulness and the depth of God's grace in Jesus lead to an attitude of gratitude?

Who might God want you to share the truths about the extent of our sin and the depth of God's grace in Jesus with? Look for opportunities and do that!
